The Birmingham Farmers Market Returns this Season with Local Vendors, Fitness Fun, Live Music and More!

BIRMINGHAM, MI, April 11, 2025 – The Birmingham Farmers Market returns for the season with local vendors, fitness activities, live music, kids crafts, and other attractions.

The market opens for the season on Sunday, May 4, with its annual Opening Day Celebration featuring live music, kids' activities, and free reusable tote bags (while supplies last).

The bustling outdoor market draws thousands of visitors each season to shop local produce and artisan goods, listen to live music and gather with family and friends. The market is open every Sunday, May 4 through October 26, from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., and is located in Public Parking Lot 6 at 660 North Old Woodward Avenue in downtown Birmingham.

In addition to weekly live music, a kids' zone and food trucks, the market will host several special events including:

*Second Sundays will feature a fitness or wellness-themed activity from local providers including Gazelle Sports, and Community Yoga.

By late spring, shoppers will find leafy greens, root vegetables, herbs, early organic vegetables, strawberries, zucchini, cucumbers, tomatoes, peppers, beans, mushrooms, green onions, sugar peas, and more.
